Entry Information

Entries Open 1 April 2019

Entry Deadline

Individual Entries close **TUESDAY 28 May 2019 at 11.59pm.**

Relay Entries close **WEDNESDAY 29 May 2019 at 11.59pm.**

Late entries will be accepted for 24hrs, as per SNZ Policy 006. A \$50 (NZD) late entry fee will apply.

Entry Process

All entries, including Para, must be submitted via the SNZ National Database. Individuals will be able to access and complete their entries online via their MyPage.

There is no limit on the number of individual event entries.

Qualification Criteria

The qualifying period is from **1 January 2018 to 28 May 2019.**

The qualifying times are 50m Long Course times. Only Long Course times can be used for qualification. All swimmers shall only enter qualified events.

Swimming New Zealand do not accept converted times for entry into this meet. Only results from approved meets will be able to be used as qualifying times. A list of approved results can be found [here](#).

Individual entry times will be generated by the SNZ Database. Performances from International, Regional and Local competitions not held within the database will not be eligible for use to enter this championship.

Entry Fees

NZ athlete entry fees are \$22.50NZD per individual event and \$45.00NZD for relay events.

International or manual entry fees are \$25.00NZD per individual event and \$50.00NZD for relay events.

Entry fees must be paid prior to the start of the meet. If they have not been paid it will result in the withdrawal of swimmers.

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Clubs and Regions that have not paid the required entry fees at the closing date of entries will be invoiced by Swimming New Zealand.

International Entries

Visitors will be able to submit entries using either a TM File or spreadsheet available on the event [website](#). This need to be emailed to events@swimming.org.nz by the entry deadline date specified above.

Foreign entries also need to be accompanied with a signed Travel Authorisation Form/Letter from the national federation.

Foreign clubs are required to provide a proof of entries report upon submission of entries.

A maximum of two (2) international visitors may progress from heats to finals in any one event. There is no limit on international visitor entries for timed-finals but only two (2) international visitors may swim in the fastest timed-final.

Relays

Relays will be timed-finals with all timed-finals being swum at the end of the final's session. Relay events can be entered by a national selection team (for selection purposes), a club team or a regional/zonal team. Priority of selection to teams will be in that order. Event Specifications

Finals

For 50m, 100m, 200m and 400m events there will be A and B finals. B finals will be swum when there are 20 swimmers that competed in the morning heats.

The Open Championship placing's will be determined from the A final. B finals will not score at this championship.

Please note that B Finals will be swum prior to the A Finals. Both A and B Final Swimmers will be marshalled at the same time.

Timed Finals

The 800m Free and 1500m Free for both Males and Females will be swum as timed finals with the only the fastest timed final swum in the finals session of that particular day.

Withdrawals

Withdrawals from Session One events at the NZ Open Championships need to be submitted at the Team Managers meeting held the day prior to the start of the meet. All other Heat withdrawals must be done prior to the end of session preceding the Heat in question.

Withdrawals from finals need to be submitted 30 minutes from posting of event results. Any withdrawals submitted after the deadline will incur a withdrawal fee of \$50NZD.

As some events are timed finals SNZ Policy 008 will apply. Withdrawals must be advised by the end of the session preceding the start of the timed final event. i.e. the session before.

Protests

Protests must be submitted to the referee, in writing, on the protest form by the team manager only within 30 minutes following the conclusion of the respective event. This needs to be accompanied in cash by the \$100.00 protest fee.

If conditions causing a potential protest are noted prior to the event a protest must be lodged before the signal to start is given.

All protests shall be considered by the referee. If the referee rejects the protest, they must state the reasons for their decision. The regional Team Manager may appeal the rejection to the Jury of Appeal whose decision shall be final.

If the protest is rejected, the deposit will be forfeited to SNZ. If the protest is upheld the deposit will be returned.

Other T's & C's

Event Photography and Livestreaming

Participants who have entered this event agree to allow photograph, video multimedia or film likeness taken by accredited photographers to be used for any legitimate purpose by Swimming New Zealand or others as approved by Swimming New Zealand.

Medal Ceremonies

There is to be strictly NO PHOTOGRAPHY in the medal presentation area, all photo's will be taken by the official event photographer and photo's will be made available on the SNZ Facebook page. Anyone taking photos in this area will be asked to leave immediately.

Athlete Competition Information

Session Times

- Heat Sessions: Warm Up 8.00am – 9.50am, 10.00am start
- Final Sessions: Warm Up 5.00pm – 6.30pm, 7.00pm start

Pool Access

Swimmers/Coaches/Team Managers:

Access to the pool for all swimmers, coaches and team managers is via the swimmer's entrance at the far end of the building. Accreditation must be worn, around the neck, to gain access. No accreditation no entry. Lost accreditation can be replaced at a cost of \$5.00 each.

Access to the pool will be available from 7:45am in the morning and 4:45pm for evening session.

Para Athletes

The 2019 AON New Zealand Open Championships are open to Para Athletes.

Heats and finals will only take place for para class events which are deemed Tokyo 2020 Paralympic events by World Para Swimming.

For events which are specific to certain classifications, priority will be given to swimmers whom the race is a Paralympic event – i.e. if an S10 swimmer wishes to compete in 200m free (a Paralympic event for S1-5 and S14) a final will only take place if a S1-5 or S14 swimmer is competing in it. If a final is run, the S10 swimmer may swim in the final.

A heat swim will still be available for the para events listed in the programme even if it is a non-Paralympic event for a swimmer. If you wish to to compete in a non-Paralympic event, please contact National Para Swimming Development Coordinator, Cameron Leslie, on cameron@swimming.org.nz to seek clarification on relevant qualification times.

Parking

Parking is limited at the AUT Millennium facility. Please try and limit the number of vehicles you travel in to the meet.

Please note: Paid parking has been recently introduced at AUT Millennium, 90 minutes free with a cost of \$2.00 per hour thereafter. Additional parking information at www.autmillennium.org.nz/parking. All day parking will cost \$10.00.

Athlete Seating

The seating plan will be posted on the SNZ website.

Clubs/Regions are asked to ensure that swimmers with allocated seating do not procure additional seats.

If your team is seated in the upstairs grandstand please dry off in the changing rooms before proceeding up the stairs.

Warm-up Procedure

SNZ use a standard warm-up procedure for all national competitions. Please refer to the warm-up procedure document on the SNZ website.

The main race pool will be available for Warm Ups prior to racing. In addition, five lanes in the pool in the main AUT Millennium complex will be available for Warm Up/Cool Down from 10.00-12.30pm and 6.30-9.00pm.

Marshalling Process

Heats:

Self-marshalling will be employed during all heats sessions.

Swimmers are asked to be in the marshalling area 4 heats prior to their event. For all 50m events swimmers need to be in the heats marshalling area 6 heats prior to their event.

Finals:

Swimmers will need to be in the marshalling area 4 races prior to their event and remain in the marshalling area. All swimmers are required to marshal for relays. Swimsuits will be checked at marshalling for legality.

Winner Interviews

All **A FINAL winners** in the evening sessions will be asked to complete a short winner interview at the conclusion of the race.

Strapping

Swimmers with strapping must provide documentation from a relevant registered health practitioner or physiotherapist and be reviewed by the Technical Director prior to swimming. Any swimmers without such documentation will not be permitted to swim.

Results

Results will be posted around the pool:

- On the wall next to the learn to swim pool.
- On the wall between the changing rooms on the entrance side of the pool.

Swimming New Zealand will have live results via the SNZ website and Meet Mobile. The results for each event will be uploaded once the event has been signed off.

A PDF of each session's results will be posted on the events page at the conclusion of each session.

Disqualifications

Disqualifications will be announced and a copy of the DQ form put in the Regional Team Manager Box.

Opening Ceremony

An opening ceremony will be held at the start of Session 2 on Monday 17 June starting at 6.40pm. As such, the warm up time in the 50m pool will be reduced by 20 minutes to allow for this.

Each region is to provide two representatives in uniform for the march past. These people are to assemble by the main entrance at 6.30pm.

Victory Ceremonies

Medals shall be awarded for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd New Zealanders in all events.

Visitor medals will be awarded to any International competitor who places.

As the event is livestreamed please ensure that medals aren't removed from around winners necks until well clear of the medal dais.

The Victory Ceremony Timetable will be included in the finals programmes, and we will endeavour to run to this timetable. If for any reason there is a delay in the results being available, the medal presentation for that event will take place as soon as possible.

Dress Standard for victory ceremonies:

- Club or Regional t-shirt, jacket or sweatshirt.
- No Caps or Goggles.
- No towels to be wrapped around the waist.

IT IS AN EXPECTATION THAT ALL SWIMMERS ARE PRESENT AND DRESSED APPROPRIATELY TO RECEIVE THEIR MEDAL.

Banner Placement

Swimming New Zealand will have signage at the 2019 NZ Open Championships; this signage takes precedence for position over regional and club banners. SNZ Reserves the right to remove any banners that are not in appropriate areas or conflict with event signage and/or sponsors.

Club/Regional Team Managers Information**Accreditation**

Teams are required to complete the [coaches and managers form](#) on their team personnel attending the meet. Event passes will be allocated to clubs based on this information. The deadline for Coach and Manager accreditation is Wednesday 29 May at 9.00am.

Clubs are entitled to nominate coaches and team managers based on the number of swimmers they have competing as follows:

- 1-10 Swimmers = 2 coaches/managers
- 11-20 Swimmers = 3 coaches/managers
- 21-30 Swimmers = 4 coaches/managers
- 31+ Swimmers = 5 coaches/managers

Accreditation Criteria

Coaches must be registered with Swimming New Zealand as a premium coach and must be showing as financial and active in the Swimming New Zealand database.

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Managers must be an active member on the Swimming New Zealand database. They can be registered as volunteer membership type. They are not permitted to be undertaking any coaching on pool deck.

Swimmers will all be issued a pass. Passes must be worn while on pool deck, anyone not wearing a pass will be asked to move to the spectator's area.

Pre-Meet Training

Pre-event training is as follows:

Sunday 16 June 2019: 8.00am – 12.00pm
 3.00pm – 7.00pm

Pool entry is free for training at these times. Access will be through the main entrance of the complex.

Clubs/Regions that wish to train outside these times will have to organise their own times with the pool and pay entry.

Managers Meeting

There will be a team manager meeting held on **Sunday 16 June at 5.00pm** at the venue, room to be confirmed. Regional and Club Managers will be given a brief run-down of meet activities, expectations of swimmers and clubs and general delivery of the event. Each club is asked to have at least one representative at the meeting to ensure all information is delivered back to the swimmers.

Collection of Packs

Team Racepacks must be collected by Regional or Club Team Managers from the Managers Meeting.

Session Programmes

Session programmes will be placed in regional boxes at the Resolutions desk. Relay and Withdrawal forms will be available from here also. Session programme numbers are based on the Coaches and Managers form.

Timelines

Timelines will be included in both heats and finals session programmes. The times shown are approximate and races may start before or after the times indicated. It is the swimmers responsibility to be at marshalling at the appropriate time (i.e. 4 heats before a swimmers scheduled race).

Event Communication

During the meet SNZ will use the multi-txt system to communicate to coaches and managers during the meet, please ensure your contact details are correct.

Spectator Entry

Spectators will access the pool via the main entrance from 8:00am in the morning and 5:00pm for evening session. Spectators will have access to the pool via the event entrance and are not to access the pool deck, if you are on pool deck without a correct pass you will be asked to move back to the spectator area.

Photography

Spectators agree upon entry that photographic, video or audio recording equipment is prohibited for any purpose which may include, without limitation, video and/or audio recorders, camera tripods, monopods or lenses with a total focal strength of greater than 300mm and commercial digital video equipment. The Event Management Staff will, at their sole discretion, determine whether or not an item is intended for personal or commercial use.
